My success criteria	1	2	3	4
My heading: I create a clear title which tells the reader what they will make or do.				
I decide to have sub-headings if it will be helpful				
My opening paragraph: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> gives the reader some background information 				
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> explains the point of making or doing this 				
What you need/equipment or materials list: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> tells the reader everything they need I do this clearly, maybe in a list and/or using bullet points 				
The main instruction section: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> I give step by step instructions 				
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I use short, clear opening sentences 				
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I write my instructions in a clear, sequential order 				
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I use imperative verbs (a good range of these) 				
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I use sequence connectives (a good range, including: first...next...after that ...finally) 				
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I use other connectives (because, if...then) to give explanation 				
My end paragraph: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> encourages people to have a go at making or doing this thing gives any final hints or tips 				
When I finish, I read my writing to check that: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> I have used a variety of sentence types I have used a variety of sentence starters
